Oh the joy of getting seed catalogs! Mine started arriving in early December. I resisted the temptation to curl up in a chair with a cup of cocoa and spend hours poring over each one. Instead, I put each brightly colored catalog that arrived in the mail every day in a large drawer so that none would be lost to accidental recycling, and ignored my husband's comments that we were soon going to have to build an extension onto the house to hold them all... I plowed forward with the wrapping and baking and decorating demands of the season, knowing that once the excitement of the holidays past, I could revel in each one.

Now that the tree is down and the decorations once again relegated to the basement, I have opened the drawer and begun to dream of what my garden could be next year. Each year I incorporate at least one or two new types of flowers or vegetables that I have not tried before. Sometimes they are successful, other times they are complete failures. Last year one of my successful new plantings was watermelon radish. If you are looking for something simple to amaze and impress your non-gardening friends, this is it. It is a very large round white radish with a green inner ring and a bright pink center. When you slice it, it looks like a watermelon. It is not extremely spicy, takes much longer to grow than your average radish but oh, the compliments you get when you serve it!

For years the only catalog I ever received was from Burpee and as a novice gardener, I was perfectly happy with that. Then one year a new seed catalog arrived. It was as if someone had handed me a new chapter in a book I had read over and over. It occurred to me that if this other seed catalog existed, maybe there were others out there. And to Google I went searching for new catalogs and getting on every seed catalog mailing list. I have been hooked ever since and see no reason to give up this happy obsession.

The seed catalogs I receive from all over the country offer some of the same standards, but they also offer different plants and, lucky me, I get to sit with my cup of cocoa and look at each one to see what looks tempting. I think I have learned as much from my seed catalogs

as I have from any gardening books since I have found that many include detailed growing information. As my gardening knowledge has increased, I am choosing more of the open grown varieties in order to experiment with saving my own seeds. This year I am looking at trying out Chinese Green Luobo radishes, Cha-Cha chives and Lazy Housewife Green Beans. Let us know what you are trying new this year!!
